## 2017 ADA YEAR END REPORT


Our largest construction projects for 2017 was within the Park Department. The Department applied for and was approved for a \$4.1 million dollar bond to be used for several construction projects. Three (3) of the projects included ADA compliances.

The first project was for the Lake Front Enhancement project. They removed all of the paver brick walkways due to the fact that they no longer met ADA guidelines, removed the guard railings from along the lake, removed the electrical lighting and some curbs, gutters, stairs and street ways. This will be a two (2) year project as they are replacing the Lake Front railings with an ADA approved concrete wall, replacing the brick pavers with concrete sidewalks, new steps, crosswalks and lighting. The estimated cost of the Lake Front enhancement project is \$693,788.00.

The next project was to hire the Company, ADA Consultants of Indiana, to conduct an ADA survey of all our twenty-three (23) parks and all buildings and park equipment on them, for ADA compliance. The Park Department will then use the survey information to redesign all our parks and replace park equipment with ADA compliant equipment. This project will last several years. The cost of the survey was \$43,700.00.

The last major project for the Park Department for 2017 was to complete renovations of our public pool to make the pool ADA compliant. They installed a new splash pad that is wheelchair accessible, new concrete walkways and new fencing to make the pool safer. The cost for this project was \$65,400.00.

The City of Hobart did not do a 50/50 sidewalk program this year. Instead we put all our resources into extensive street scape projects. We spent \$2,597,782.35 dollars on replacing sidewalks, corners, ramps and streets to make them ADA compliant. Our 2017 scrapbook has before, during and after pictures of the projects in it. The scrapbook can be seen in the City of Hobart Clerk – Treasurer's Office. There is a scrapbook for every year since we started our ADA enhancement program.
